Class Title: Bringing Authenticity into Your Performance through Theater Skills

Category: Expression; Audience Connection; Theatrical Skills

**Length:** 60-90 minutes

**Description:** We'll discuss what makes any performance memorable. Using practical and

usable methods from the theater, we explore ways to develop greater

connection and authenticity in your song message delivery.

Class Title: Musical Theater Academy: Bringing Your Songs & Stories to Life on Stage

Category: Open Division/Entertainment Packaging

**Length:** 5 (or 6) 1–hour classes

**Description:** Looking at professional theater elements and examples as well as BBS

entertainment, we'll look at what makes up great entertainment, how you can create strong audience connection and how you learn to step out of

yourself into a character or story.

Class Title: Understanding & Building Breath Energy to Propel Your Musical Messages

Category: Expression; Sound; Vocal/Breath Skills

**Length:** 50–60 minutes

**Description:** We'll look at the breathing mechanism and helping every singer learn to

engage the magic of energized air. With hands-on methods for learning and

teaching, this makes breath energy attainable for all singers.

Class Title: Leadership Classes to Meet Your Needs

Category: Leadership

**Length:** 50+ minutes for each class

**Description:** I have multiple leadership classes to choose from:

1. What is Leadership? (Qualities, Skills and Methods);

Inspirational classes: 2. A Hero's Journey 3. A Leader's Heart

4. Leading through Transition and Change5. Visioning, Values and Strategic Planning

Class Title: Beginning Musicianship Skills

Category: Arranger Skills/Music Theory

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** Explanation and discussion of the basic elements of theory and music

reading - notes, intervals, rhythms, chords and how they apply to our

music. We'll make music theory fun!

Class Title: Planning for Your Future

Category: Leadership
Length: 1-4 hours

**Description:** This can be either an explanation and interactive work on how to do long

range planning with your chorus OR it can be the actual process of

developing goals and doing long-range planning with the group. This is very group-centered, so space, creativity, and time are very important. Then the

fun begins!

Class Title: Physical Expression, Characterization and Musicality

Category: Choreography

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** Using expressive movements to not only tell your story, but to cue your

vocal skills as well. This looks at singers of various genres to examine how they use their body to achieve their best performance and then transfers these observations into your personal performance. Each student can identify what moves they make that best cues their body to sing as trained!

Class Title: You are a Winner

Category: Coaching/Teaching

**Length:** 60-90 minutes

**Description:** Can be done with a live quartet or chorus or analytical listening with video

or CD.

Class Title: Communicating as Leaders

Category: Leadership
Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** Exploring the areas that need communication between musical leaders,

especially director and her assistant director. Topics, ways to approach,

and reaching understanding in a positive manner.

Class Title: Make 'Em Laugh! Let 'Em Love...

Category: Performance Packaging

**Length:** 60 minutes

**Description:** Ideas and examples for how to start and build on ideas and deliver them

effectively.

Class Title: Developing Directing Skills

Category: Directing

**Length:** 60-90 minutes

**Description:** An Interactive class that explores and practices the beginnings of clear,

effective directing movements- entrances, cut-offs, breaths, tempo,

eliminating interference and giving the body alignment and look with which you want the chorus to sing. A song will be used to explore these elements

and then class members will be asked to volunteer to direct.

Class Title: Your Chorus by Improving Yourself

Category: Directing

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** This class explores some of the more intricate parts of directing - vocal skill

reminder cues, tempo changes, backbeat, different breathing style cues, clarity In rhythmic areas, etc. This interactive class will use a song for directors first to identify the challenges and then learn by watching and

doing.

Class Title: Performance Skills that Communicate

Category: Judging

**Length:** 60 minutes

**Description:** An exploration of the 5 elements the judges are looking in the Open

Division and International Finals Contests. We 'II review performance videos and discuss the things that happen in performance, ways to improve those and ways to pursue even greater ways of communicating with your

audience.

Class Title: Taking Your Scores to the Next Level

Category: General

**Length:** 60 minutes

**Description:** After reviewing video performances, we 'II discuss the level, characteristics

of that level and what areas of improvement will make the biggest different for score improvement. Each level will be covered - from low C to A. This

can be geared to Quartet or Chorus audiences.

Class Title: The Levels of B

Category: General

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** We will review performances from each B level (B-. Band B+), discuss the

characteristics, challenges and positives of each level, then learn how each level can grow and learn to move into a higher level. This can be geared to

Quartet or Chorus learners.

Class Title: The Levels of A

Category: General

**Length:** 60 minutes

**Description:** We will review performances from each of the A levels (A-, A, A+), discuss

the characteristics, challenges and excellence of each level, then explore how these outstanding performers can move even further into artistry,

musical magic and the next level.

Class Title: Understanding and Applying the Expression Category

Category: Performance Packaging

**Length:** 60-90 minutes

**Description:** A look at the technical and artistic elements of the Expression Category to

understand what all the elements mean, how they create and communicate a truly expressive performance. Uses recorded performances as examples.

Can be done with a quartet as a demo.

Class Title: The Mystery of Forward Motion

Category: General

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** What do they mean by "forward motion"? Where did that concept come

from and how do we apply it effectively? Helping to dispel the

myths and misunderstandings of the crucial element of the Expression

category.

Class Title: Care and Feeding of New Members Class

Category: Member Recruitment/Retention

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** Ideas, examples and inspiration for developing an effective "Rookie"/new

member program that teaches, connects and retains new

members. Practical, proven ideas that work.

Class Title: Lighting the Darkness Class

Category: Performance Packaging

**Length:** 60-90 minutes

**Description:** A deeper look into the Expression Category: elements, artistry and scoring

higher. Will explore expression judging comments at each level and how to raise your score while enjoying every minute of the journey. Uses lots of

kinesthetic means of accomplishing expressive delivery. An

active, participatory class.

Class Title: You Gotta Have Heart

**Length:** 60 minutes

the team and individuals, how to build accountability into your team

experience and maintaining a healthy, high-performance team.

Class Title: Developing Future Leaders

Category: Leadership
Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** We 'Il explore where you find future leaders, what mentoring is (and isn't),

how to be a mentor, encouraging those you mentor or who

you think would be an effective future leader. Leadership development is

best done by mentoring.

Class Title: Leading an Effective Meeting

Category: Leadership
Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** Elements of an effective meeting, detriments to having an effective meeting

and how to conduct an effective meeting.

Class Title: Working with Challenges

Category: Chorus Culture

Length: 60-90 minutes

**Description:** We will explore the challenges the region is facing currently and look at

various ways to work with these challenges - Distance,

shrinking/disappearing choruses, lack of leadership, building choruses through crisis, etc. Previous contact can help create this class to be very

specific to your needs.

Class Title: Fill Up Your Tool Box

**Length:** 60 minutes

**Description:** Group sharing and exploration of new ideas and tips for creating even more

fun and effective learning in your rehearsals.

Class Title: Conducting a Rockin' Sectional

Category: Rehearsals & Performance

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** We 'Il explore various ways to conduct a sectional, discuss the many

reasons we have sectionals, focusing our section, and building

independence and section unity.

Class Title: Creating the Charmed Sweet Adeline Life

Category: General

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** This class will explore the difference between stress and bum-out and the

contributing factors to these conditions. Then we will explore the various ways we can help ourselves to return to and maintain the joy, love and fun

of singing together in this hobby we loved from the beginning.

Class Title: Teams Who Play Together, Stay Together!

Category: 60-90 minutes

Length: Chorus Culture

**Description:** Using various games, we 'II explore how teams work, how Individuals

contribute (or not) to the effectiveness/success of the team, and laugh our

way to building a better team.

Class Title: Developing Artistic Sound

Category: Vocal Production

Length: 60 minutes

**Description:** This class will explore the vocal mechanisms in place and how to let them

work with freedom. Once the basics are teamed and consistently growing, musical, artistic sound can flourish. Developing emotional connection to

your audience and your message.

Class Title: Warm-Ups that Work

Category: Vocal Production

**Length:** 60 minutes

**Description:** While several new warm-ups will be introduced, the major focus of this is

developing the warm-ups to meet the needs that each group is facing at any time. Various warm ups will be used to examine the various areas of

vocal skill building that can be taught through almost any vocalise.
