


ZOOM MEETING FOR PARTICIPANTS: ANDROID

Zoom: Buttons (Android)

Don't see buttons at the top and bottom of the screen? Tap anywhere on the screen (except for on the buttons) to


show or hide the buttons.

Turn "speaker phone" mode on/off. Leave this on, as shown here (unless you're holding the phone up to your ear).

Warning: You might get feedback if your volume is high. In this case, <u>turn down your volume</u>. You'll also get feedback if you have two devices connected to the audio of the same Zoom call. If this happens, hang up one device (or mute that device <u>and</u> turn its volume all the way down).


Start/Stop Video: control whether people can see you.

Mute/Unmute: control whether people can hear you.



Share (usually only used by the host): share your screen, a photo, file, link, or other resource.

Zoom: Modes (Android)




1. When you enter the meeting, you will see <u>Active Speaker mode</u>: a large video of whoever is speaking, and a small video of yourself in the lower right. Tip: Switch modes between seeing one person at a time, or many people at a time.



 Swipe to the left from Active Speaker for
Gallery mode: smaller videos of multiple people.
You might not see everyone in Gallery mode if there are many people on the call.

Swipe to the right to return to Active Speaker mode.




3. <u>Swipe to the right</u> from Active Speaker for <u>Safe Driving mode</u>: a mode that you probably only want while driving. It stops your video and mutes your microphone (unmute with "Tap to Speak").

Swipe to the left to return to Active Speaker mode.


Zoom: Chatting (Android)

Tip: Use Chat to communicate when your microphone is muted.





Zoom: Raising/Lowering Your Hand (Android)

Tip: Raise your hand to let the host know you wish to speak.




Zoom: Sharing Your Screen (Android)





Warning: Use this feature only if you really want everyone to see what's on your screen. In most cases this will only be used by the host.



- 3. Zoom might take you to this page. Switch this setting "On" (to the right).
- 4. Everyone can now see what you're seeing on your phone. Navigate around your phone to show what you want to show.

5. When you're done, go back to Zoom (for example, by opening Zoom from your home screen), and click the Stop Share button with a square on it.
