## Zoom Setup

 (Android)2. No sign in/up needed. Tap Join a Meeting.
3. Install the ZOOM Cloud Meetings app from Google Play.

4. If you want people to see you, Join with Video. If not, Join without Video.
5. If you want people to hear you, Call via Device Audio.
6. Enter the meeting ID and your name. Make your name unique (for example, include your last name) if there are many people in your Zoom group with the same first name. Tap Join Meeting.

7. If you want people to hear you, Allow. If not,
Deny.
8. Tap Got it. (This does not give Zoom any permissions yet.)

9. You did it! You may need to unmute yourself if desired.
10. If you want people to see you over video, tap Allow. If not, Deny.

## Zoom: Buttons (Android)

## Don't see buttons at the top and bottom of the screen?

 Tap anywhere on the screen (except for on the buttons) to show or hide the buttons.Turn "speaker phone" mode on/off. Leave this on, as shown here (unless you're holding the phone up to your ear).

Warning: You might get feedback if your volume is high. In this case, turn down your volume. You'll also get feedback if you have two devices connected to the audio of the same Zoom call. If this happens, hang up one device (or mute that device and turn its volume all the way down).

Start/Stop Video: control whether people can see you.

Mute/Unmute: control whether people can hear you.


Participants: see a list of participants, Chat (use Chat to communicate when your microphone is muted).

## Your video.

More: clap, thumbs up, raise/lower hand, and more.

Share (usually only used by the host): share your screen, a photo, file, link, or other resource.

Tip: Switch modes between seeing one person at a time, or many people at a time.


1. When you enter the meeting, you will see Active Speaker mode: a large video of whoever is speaking, and a small video of yourself in the lower right.

2. Swipe to the left from Active Speaker for Gallery mode: smaller videos of multiple people. You might not see everyone in Gallery mode if there are many people on the call.

Swipe to the right to return to Active Speaker mode.

Tip: Use Chat to communicate when your microphone is muted.


5. Write your message and click Send.
6. Click Close at the top left to go back.

## Zoom: Raising/Lowering Your Hand (Android)

Tip: Raise your hand to let the host know you wish to speak.


1. From the bottom of the Zoom screen, tap More.
Then tap Raise Hand.

2. You will see a "hand" icon while your hand is raised.

3. If you no longer want your hand raised, tap More, and then tap Lower Hand.

Zoom: Sharing Your Screen (Android)

2. Be aware that everything you see on your phone will be visible to everyone while you are screen sharing. Then click Start now.

Warning: Use this feature only if you really want everyone to see what's on your screen. In most cases this will only be used by the host.
