What is barbershop harmony?

In simple terms, barbershop harmony is an American art form featuring vocal harmony produced by four parts: tenor, lead, baritone, and bass.

- ❖ Tenor – sings the harmony above the lead. Although tenor is the highest voice in barbershop harmony, it should not be confused with the soprano of traditional choral singing. Tenor voice should have a sweet, pure tone that will compliment, but not overpower the lead voice.
- ❖ Lead – often the melody and has a range from A below middle C, to the C above middle C.
- ❖ Baritone – sings in harmony with a range similar to the lead.
- ❖ Bass – should have a rich, resonant sound and be able to comfortably sing pitches as low as E flat below middle C.

Youth Affiliate Chorus:

The Youth Affiliate Chorus program specifically fulfills Sing United's guiding principles of Outreach and Musical Excellence, as it provides educational resources, including a lesson plan, and opportunities for to receive feedback from professional judges, while actively promoting the barbershop style into high school communities. The program is designed to allow developed high school choral programs to affiliate with Sweet Adelines, and to experience the benefits of Sweet Adelines membership without requiring each student to pay the yearly membership dues that regular members of Sweet Adelines International pay. Instead, the school would maintain the charter, and be responsible for the charter fee of \$125 USD a year. Liability insurance is available and required if the school does not have this.

Benefits:

- ❖ One free director affiliate membership. This will allow the choral director to have access to our full library of educational tools and resources.
- ❖ A four-part lesson plan that introduces youth singers to the ins and outs of singing in the barbershop style.
- ❖ Complimentary piece of music for each student in the Youth Affiliate Chorus, with learning tracks.
- ❖ Access to academic scholarship opportunities, which are only available to Sweet Adelines members.
- ❖ Opportunity to perform for Evaluation at your local regional competition and convention, including a waived competition entry fee. **Note that while the entry fee for competing will be waived, other fees, as dictated by the region would still be applicable.*

- ❖ Receive access to educational resources for your singers to learn four-part a cappella harmony in the barbershop style, to elevate the musical abilities, experiences, and achievements of your chorus members.
- ❖ Promote interest, and enhance, your community's awareness of barbershop and a cappella music and Sweet Adelines International.
- ❖ Facilitate a cultural and recreational outlet for your chorus through rehearsal and performance of music.
- ❖ Encourage the participation of youth in a cappella performances and foster a lifelong pursuit of involvement in the arts.
