I moved to Louisville, Kentucky, joined a Sweet Adelines chorus, sang Lead in the Regional Champion and International Finalist Quartet, Harmony Highlights, for many years with my best friends. I have been on the Regional and International faculty, in the judging program and taught choreography and showmanship classes at many Regional and International Schools and have loved coaching quartets and choruses around the country. I am a Certified Director and the Associate Director and Choreographer for the Pride of Kentucky Chorus which is looking forward to competing in International competition in 2021! We are still looking forward, however, to welcoming all of you to Louisville, Kentucky in 2023!
