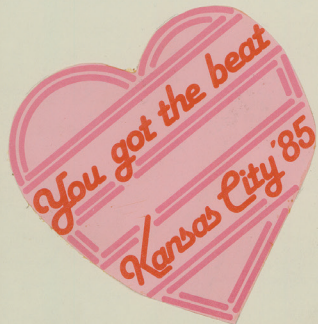
Welcome, New Zealand!

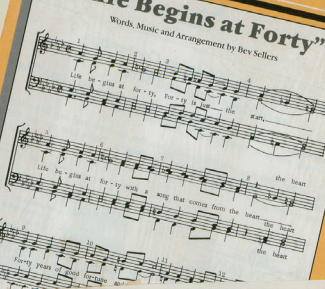
