BEV SELLERS SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS ANNOUNCED

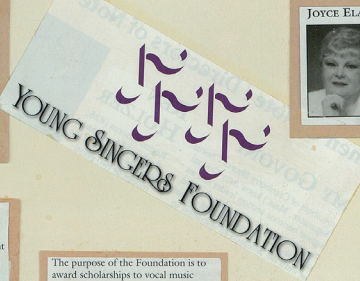

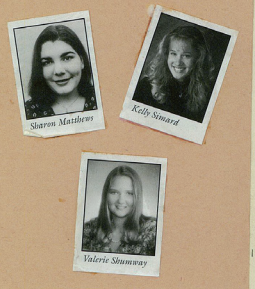

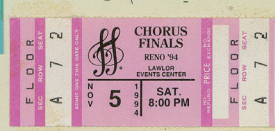
